# Liquor Licence Self-Assessment Compliance Audit Checklist

#### May 2023

This self-assessment compliance audit checklist has been developed to assist licensees in assessing their level of compliance with legislation, regulations, licence conditions and codes of practice.

Completion of the form is encouraged by Consumer and Business Services (CBS).

While not mandatory, it is strongly recommended that the self-assessment checklist:

- be completed by a licensee at least every six months
- be viewed and signed off by a Responsible Person and the licensee (or an operational director or committee member if the licensee is a body corporate).

The levy (**currently fixed at \$92**) is imposed in addition to any of the above penalties and applies to all expiations issued under legislation administered by CBS, including the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997* and associated regulations.
