Reasons for Decision

In reaching my determination, I have had regard to the objects of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*.

In order to grant the application I must be satisfied that it is in the community interest to do so, taking into account the harm that might be caused, the cultural, recreational, employment or tourism impacts and the social impact on the amenity of the locality.

I note that the application is for an indoor golf venue which holds stimulators to allow patrons to play virtual rounds of golf for leisure as well as to practice and receive coaching.

It is clear from the plans supplied that the retail section and the licensed area will be completely separate and the retail store will not be accessible when the store is closed. I note that the licensee is to have appropriate signage placed in the venue to ensure patrons are aware of where the licensed area is.

I am satisfied that, given the nature of the business, this business will pose a very low risk of harm to the community. This application will also not negatively affect the amenity of the locality, but rather add to the offerings in the Western Adelaide area as there are a number of other licensed premises in the locality, such as restaurants, on the west and east side of the premises. The business intends to operate a unique experience, offering a range of play experiences of virtual golf accompanied by liquor, which will compliment the more traditional liquor offerings in the area.

Having considered all the information before me, I am satisfied that the granting of this application is in the community interest.
