Reasons for Decision

Grant of licence

The application is for the grant of a restaurant and catering licence. The applicant has addressed the objects of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997* (the Act) in their application and I am satisfied the sale, supply and consumption of liquor will be undertaken safely and responsibly, consistent with the principle of responsible service and consumption of liquor and the expectations and aspirations of the public.

I am satisfied the grant of the licence would not be contrary to the public interest or inconsistent with the objects of the Act.

Pursuant to section 56 of the Act, I am satisfied Mr Ian Archbold, who occupies a position of authority in the entity holding the licence, is a fit and proper person to occupy such a position.

Pursuant to section 72 of the Act, I am satisfied the lessor has consented to the application.

The application is granted.

Responsible person exemption

It is a requirement under section 97(1) of the Act, that premises must be personally supervised by a responsible person at all times while business is conducted under the licence. Under section 97(2) of the Act, the Commissioner may exempt a licensee from this requirement and approve alternative arrangements for the supervision and management of the business. An exemption can only be granted if the licensing authority is satisfied that, in view of the limited scope of a business conducted under a licence, an exemption would not compromise the principle of responsible service and consumption of liquor.

The applicant has applied for an exemption from this requirement and has submitted the following reasons why they should be granted an exemption:

- Limited nature of the business - catering only


Matters weighing against the granting of this exemption include:

- The applicant's business will involve the sale and supply of liquor at premises not identified at the time of granting this licence. Functions may be held at locations, including the Adelaide CBD, where particular vigilance is required to ensure the sale, supply and consumption of liquor is undertaken safely and responsibly.
- Significant numbers of people, including minors, may attend functions catered by the applicant.
- The applicant has been authorised to sell and supply liquor seven days a week at functions operating until 2am.
- Significant volumes of alcohol may be consumed at functions catered by the applicant.

Having considered these matters, I am not satisfied that an exemption from the responsible person requirements can be granted without compromising the responsible service and consumption of liquor.

The application for a responsible person exemption is declined.
