Residential Parks – selling a dwelling

Residential Parks Act 2007

Notice to a prospective purchaser

A resident who intends to sell their dwelling must advise a prospective purchaser to contact the park owner to request the required documents. The resident must do this at least 14 business days before the agreement is assigned to the purchaser. Within seven days of receiving this request, the park owner must provide the prospective purchaser with the following documents:

- · Disclosure statement
- Site condition report
- Park rules

Location of the dwelling

• Information notice outlining residents' rights and responsibilities.

These documents will assist a purchaser in making an informed decision before they commit to living in the park.
