Premises

New Premises

The licensed area is outlined in red on the approved plan.

Capacity

The capacity of the venue is set at 120.

Licence Plan

The licensee is authorised to sell and supply liquor in an area adjacent to the premises for consumption in that area, as outlined in red on the approved plan.

Conditions

The following conditions are added to the licence

- The licensee is authorised to sell or supply the licensee's product for consumption on and off the site of the event endorsement(s) as specified on this licence.
- The sale of liquor by direct sales transactions is limited to the licensee's product only, except where the sale is by wholesale or where liquor is sold in an aggregate quantity of 4.5 litres or more.
- The approval to sell liquor in an outdoor dining area shall lapse and become of no effect if the permit issued by the local council lapses, or is cancelled, withdrawn or revoked.
- The licence authorises the sale of liquor produced by the licensee either personally or under contract. Details of all contracts entered into must be available for inspection by an authorised officer.

Reasons for Decision

In reaching my determination, I have had regard to the objects of the *Liquor Licensing Act 1997*.

The applicant has addressed the objects of the Act in their application and I am satisfied the sale, supply and consumption of liquor will be undertaken safely and responsibly, consistent with the responsible service and consumption of liquor, and the expectations and aspirations of the public.

Pursuant to section 56 of the Act, I am satisfied all persons who occupy a position of authority in the entity to hold the licence are fit and proper persons to occupy such a position.

Pursuant to section 57 of the Act, I am satisfied the proposed premises are of a sufficient standard for the purpose of carrying on business under the licence. Further, I am satisfied the operation of the licence would be unlikely to result in undue offence, annoyance, disturbance or inconvenience to people who reside, work or worship in the vicinity of the premises and or to prejudice the safety or welfare of children attending kindergarten, primary school or secondary school in the vicinity of the premises.

City of Adelaide Council has confirmed they do not object to the proposed liquor licence at the agreed capacity, operating hours and trading rights and I am satisfied all relevant approvals, consents and exemptions are in place.

Pursuant to section 72 of the Act, I am satisfied the lessor has consented to the application.

I am satisfied the proposed licence is not contrary to the public interest or inconsistent with the objects of the Act.

While trading pursuant to this licence in liquor which is not the licensee's own product, I invite the licensee to be mindful of the limitations/conditions imposed by sections 39(1)(b) and 39(1)(g) of the Act.
